Dr Régis Vaillancourt is currently the Director of Pharmacy and of Integrated Pain Services at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) in Ottawa. Dr Vaillancourt received his Bachelor of Pharmacy from the Université Laval in 1983, his hospital pharmacy residency certificate from the National Defence Medical Centre (in affiliation with University of Toronto) in 1987, and his Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Toronto in 1995.
