Nancy L Roberts

Nancy Roberts received her Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from Dalhousie University in 1982 and a Diploma in Departmental Management from the Canadian Healthcare Association in 1993. After graduation she joined The Moncton Hospital, where she held various positions on staff and served as Director of Pharmacy Services for 9 years, before her appointment as Vice President Planning and Professional Services for the South-East Regional Health Authority in June 2003. Her vice-presidential portfolio includes responsibility for quality improvement and patient safety, risk management, utilization, research, health records, and the following professional services: clinical nutrition, occupational therapy, pharmacy, physiotherapy, psychology, respiratory therapy, social work, speech language pathology, and audiology.

Nancy has been an active member of CSHP and has contributed to the Society at both the Branch and National levels on a number of committees and task forces, including serving as President of the New Brunswick Branch from 1987 to 1989 and as President of CSHP National for the 1994/95 year. She is Past-Chairperson of, and served for 6 years on, the Canadian Hospital Pharmacy Residency Board and was awarded fellowship status with the CSHP in February 2006.

Nancy was actively involved in research initiatives to support seamless pharmacy care services and is serving her seventh year as a member of the editorial board for the Hospital Pharmacy in Canada Survey.

At the provincial level, Nancy has served as hospital liaison on the Council of the provincial regulatory authority and as provincial representative on the National Continuing Competency Committee of the National Association of Regulatory Authorities. She was also a member of the New Brunswick Premier's Health Quality Council (January 2000 to January 2002) and is currently a member of the New Brunswick Primary Health Care Advisory Committee and the province's e-Health Steering Committee.

Catherine Doherty graduated from Dalhousie University College of Pharmacy in 1982 and then completed a hospital pharmacy residency program at the Halifax Infirmary. She began her hospital pharmacy career at the Nova Scotia Hospital in 1983 and soon began clinical pharmacy practice in geriatric psychiatry. In that facility she transitioned through several supervisory positions to become the Manager of Pharmacy Services. In 2001, regional integration into Capital Health District expanded her managerial roles to include staff and pharmacy operations in 6 additional facilities. Most recently, she assumed additional responsibilities as manager for clinical pharmacy services offered to patients receiving geriatric and psychiatric services throughout Capital Health, as well as having a major focus on medication safety and pharmacy professional practice.

Catherine enjoys interdisciplinary work that profiles the roles of pharmacists and pharmacy technicians, and she chairs or participates in a variety of health district committees, such as Nursing Pharmacy, Medication Safety, Drugs and Therapeutics, and, most recently, the Patient and Family Centered Care Action Team.

She has also enjoyed work with the Nova Scotia Hospital Pharmacy Managers Association, serving on the executive and on the planning committee for the annual leadership seminar for managers in the Maritime provinces. She assisted the group in developing draft regulations for hospital pharmacy practice in Nova Scotia and currently is participating in the early stages of developing a Maritime Collaborative for coaching and tracking progress with CSHP 2015 Goals.

Catherine has been a member of CSHP since 1981. She has been actively involved in the Nova Scotia Branch of the Society, serving as member or chair of the Membership, Public Relations, and Continuing Education committees at the branch level, on the Host Committee

New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award 2007/2008 Presented by Sandoz Canada Inc Adrienne J Lindblad

She then helped to initiate clinical pharmacy services on the hospital's stroke unit and in its Stroke Prevention Clinic, becoming fully involved with the multidisciplinary care of stroke patients. In fall 2007, Adrienne completed the requirements of a post-baccalaureate Doctor of Pharmacy at the University of Toronto and is expected to graduate with that degree in spring 2008.

In 2007, Adrienne was a recipient of the CSHP/Apotex Management Issues in Pharmaceutical Care Award, as well as recipient of the Professional Development Grant from CSHP—Alberta Branch. She has a number of peer-reviewed publications to her credit and has undertaken various oral and poster presentations.

Adrienne has been a preceptor for undergraduate students and an evaluator for the Alberta Hospital Pharmacy Residency Program. She has also volunteered as a mentor for CSHP's Resident Mentorship Program and is currently a mentor for the CSHP—Alberta Branch Student Mentorship Program. Recently, she was an evaluator for the Alberta College of Pharmacists Additional Prescribing Authorization Pilot Project.

Adrienne is currently a clinical coordinator with the David Thompson Health Region in Red Deer. Besides maintaining a clinical practice in neurology and medicine, Adrienne is involved with clinical program planning and staff mentoring for the region's pharmacy department.

New Hospital Pharmacy Practitioner Award 2007/2008 Presented by Sandoz Canada Inc Yvonne Kwan

Yvonne Kwan graduated with her Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from the University of Toronto in 2004. She subsequently completed her hospital pharmacy residency at the University Health Network in Toronto in 2005. Since completing her residency, Yvonne has taken on the position of staff pharmacist in the Coronary Intensive Care Unit (CICU) at the Toronto General Hospital. As an important member of this multidisciplinary team, Yvonne is involved in conducting monthly pharmacy orientation meetings for medical residents rotating in the unit. She created an electrolyte replacement chart for the nurses and participated in the development of the unit's preprinted admission order sheet. She also prepared the proposal for approval of administration of undiluted furosemide by continuous infusion, which resulted in its successful addition to the hospital's intravenous nursing drug manual. With the introduction of computerized physician order entry in the CICU this year, Yvonne worked closely with the informatics teams to review and provide input on order-screen "builds" for medications typically used in the unit. Yvonne is also an integral member of the multidisciplinary team for the outpatient heart function clinic, working with the team to optimize drug therapy for patients with heart failure.

Yvonne has been actively involved with research on medication reconciliation. Her residency project investigated the impact on medication discrepancies of medication assessments by pharmacists in a surgical preadmission clinic, and she has presented the results at CSHP Annual General Meetings and Professional Practice Conferences. The project was also recently published in the *Archives of Internal Medicine* and has received recognition through numerous awards.

Yvonne's professional education initiatives include educating nurses about antiplatelet therapy as part of the nursing orientation program, serving as an instructor for

Omolayo Famuyide is a fourth-year pharmacy student at the University of Manitoba. Born in Ibadan, Nigeria, and raised in Winnipeg, Manitoba, she obtained a Bachelor of Science degree (with distinction) in 2001 from the University of Manitoba, studying microbiology and zoology. In 2004, she began her pharmacy education at the University of Manitoba.

In her first year, she served as the local representative of the Canadian Association of Pharmacy Students and Interns (CAPSI) at the University of Manitoba. Since then, she has served and played an active role on the Executive Council of CAPSI. She has served as Executive Secretary and President-Elect and is currently President of the association. During this time, she has chaired a number of committees, including the Membership, Constitutional Review, Website, and Educational Subsidy committees.

She has served as contributing author to several publications, including "Pharmacy Students Leading Pharmacy Practice Change: A Guide for Students to Negotiate for Patient-Centred Care" and "Pandemic Preparedness: A Guide for Pharmacists in Pandemic Preparedness (a Practice-Based Educational Resource for Pharmacists)".
