

## CSHP FELLOWS

**Susan K. Bowles**

Dr Susan Bowles earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Toronto and her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo. She completed a residency in hospital pharmacy at Women's College Hospital in Toronto and a fellowship in clinical pharmacokinetics at Wayne State University and the Detroit Medical Center. Since 1988, Susan has been Clinical Coordinator — Aging Program for the Department of Pharmacy at Sunnybrook and Women's College Health Sciences Centre. She is also an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Toronto. Currently, Susan is taking an educational leave of absence from both Sunnybrook and the University of Toronto to complete a Master of Science degree in community health and epidemiology at Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

Susan serves as a reviewer for *CJHP* and has worked on several CSHP committees, including the National Educational Services Committee. She has received several awards from CSHP and has presented her work internationally.

**Christopher O. Judd**

Christopher Judd graduated from the University of Toronto in 1976 and completed a residency in hospital pharmacy at St. Joseph's Hospital in Hamilton, Ontario, in 1977. He continued on at St. Joseph's as a staff pharmacist until 1978. That year, he moved to Sunnybrook Medical Centre, North York, Ontario, as a clinical pharmacist specializing in geriatrics, later becoming supervisor of the K-Wing Satellite.



Since 1985, Chris has been manager of pharmacy services at St. Joseph's Health Care, London, Ontario. From 1996 to 2000, he has held concurrent appointments as interim manager for the Information Services Department and for the Laboratory Services Department.

Chris has participated in a wide variety of committees and task forces at St. Joseph's Health Centre, including standing committees such as the Nurse-Pharmacy and Pharmacy and Therapeutics committees; project implementation teams for IV admixtures, carded dose systems, automated dispensing technology, formulary system, and hospital formulary; hospital-wide continuous quality improvement initiatives; hospital restructuring and reengineering; and finance and operations.

Chris has also been active in CSHP, as either chair or member of a variety of groups and committees: the Professional Specialties Group in Geriatrics (Ontario Branch), the Professional Specialties Committee for CSHP (Ontario Branch), the CSHP National Computer Committee, and the ad hoc group on continuous quality improvement in pharmacy practice and accreditation, sponsored by CSHP and the Canadian Council on Health Facilities Accreditation. He is also a past president of the Ontario Branch.

In addition, Chris has been involved in several provincial task forces related to the practice of pharmacy and education standards. He has several publications to his credit and has presented at CSHP Professional Practice Conferences and other professional conferences.

## Fawziah Marra

Dr Fawziah Marra received her BSc(Pharm) from the University of British Columbia in Vancouver in 1990.
